1.3 Report from the President

CACPR offered a free webinar in April to help support programs, and identify what questions and concerns the programs had. CACPR Board Members have attended webinars regarding the need to support virtual cardiac programming hosted by the Canadian Critical Care Society. Member participation on knowledge translation tool and networking opportunities are encouraged.

CACPR has participated in the CCCS 2019 Fall Conference in Montreal. In 2019 CACPR received an unrestricted education grant from Bayer Solutions which supported guideline development, webinar development, module development, and restarting CV Edge. CACPR continues to work with Secretariat Central for support with financial and association management.

2. Financial Update

Financial History

- From 2011 to 2014, CACPR annual revenues ranged from 300 400k. Much of this revenue included sponsorship and registration funding from the Symposium event at the CCC. There was additional funding via corporate grants for the Cardiac Registry project.
- From 2014 onward, revenues from the Symposium declined significantly as the Canadian Cardiovascular
 Society began to withdraw support to participating organizations.
- Membership revenue declined moderately from 2014 onward. With the Cardiac Registry project going live in 2014, development grants diminished and stopped altogether in 2016.
- Annual revenues dropped to less than 100k by 2017.

- Organizational expenses have run at approximately 250k per year as CACPR employed multiple staff to maintain the registry, run the organization, and contribute to special projects.
- Beginning in 2015, these operating costs began to greatly exceed the revenue flowing in. The result has been increasingly large deficits (expenses in excess of revenue) in 2015 (72k), 2016 (110k) and 2017 (51k) that have eaten up CACPR reserves.
- As of 2018, a new operating model has improved operational efficiency and minimized deficits (10k 2018, 3k 2019). The budget for 2020 was initially balanced but required revision due to cancelling the spring conference because of COVID-19. New funding sources are being developed for 2020 and 2021.

New Funding Sources

- In 2019, CACPR acquired a funding commitment from Bayer to re-establish and grow the Cardiac Registry Project. Project development in underway.
- As of today (May 2020), an additional corporate commitment to this project in the amount of \$130,000 has
 occurred and multiple pharma organizations have expressed interest in also contributing.
- As a result of Bayer funding obtained in 2018, CACPR has also been developing new webinar and other
 educational content. Additional such content will be created for the virtual ASM. The sale of such web based
 educational products is another revenue stream for CACPR with about 10k expected in 2020.

Article VIII. Section 4. b.:

Every ballot, to be valid and counted in the election of Directors must be mailed, delivered or electronically sent to and be received by the Secretary of the association not later than 4 months prior to the AGM (in accordance with the Act). Any ballots not so received shall be invalid and of no effect. The ballot results shall be announced at the AGM.

Revised Bylaw would read:

Every ballot, to be valid and counted in the election of Directors must be mailed, delivered or electronically sent to and be received by the Secretary of the association prior to the AGM (in accordance with the Act). Any ballots not so received shall be invalid and of no effect. The ballot results shall be announced at the AGM.

5. Module Update

- CV Risk Factors Module is complete and available for purchase.
- Medication Module is being worked on, and will be the next one available.
- Additional Modules in progress include: Physical Activity, Psychosocial, Nutrition, Patient Management

6. Registry Update

There have been barriers with previous versions of registry, including the duplication of data entries, privacy concerns, and funding model. CACPR's approach over the last year has seen some success notably with raising funds. At present, CACPR is defining what their role is in this partnership and initiate what the Memorandum's of Understanding would look like.

7. CV Edge Update

Current editor is Dr. Warner Mampuya, and the editorial board is made of 4 members. CV Edge was restarted last Fall and 2 editions have been published. 2 more editions to be published this year. One edition will cover the Spring

Conference, and the second one will cover COVID-19 and cardiac rehab. Contribution to CV Edge and joining the editorial board is encouraged.

8. Membership Update

- Currently sitting at 130 members, typically grows with conference advertising.
- Recorded 169 members last year
- Membership committee needs to be re-invigorated. Currently only three participants.
- With the free COVID webinar we had a reach of almost 400 people how to convert these people into members
- Two academic facilities suggested lower cost of student membership would potentially increase the number of students participating.
- Current Membership is 130 active members

9. CACPR Fall 2020 Meeting

- Initially planned as traditional conference, being reformatted to be virtual
- Diamond Fernandez and Juan Murais are the Co-Chairs
- CCS still determining dates and schedules
- CACPR Fall Conference Committee has commenced has a theme, and format identified.
- Room for additional people who would like to be on the planning committee.
- Anticipate broader attendance due to virtual format

10. Guidelines Update

Dr. Simon Bacon is leading the guidelines work. The guidelines will be structured based on topics rather than a comprehensive volume or book. Currently, they are working on a position statement regarding exercise to be released in early 2021. There will also be a risk reduction position statement to be released. Other popular topics rated by poll participants and experts will be covered as well. Membership participation is welcome.

11. Webinar Update

- Two Free Webinars offered in 2019
- Three revenue generating webinars in 2020 to date
- One free webinar in 2020 to date COVID-19 most popular with almost 300 attendees
- Updated Zoom package, can accommodate 500 registrants, additional features to improve webinar experience
