1.3 Report from the President

CACPR Executive Committee and Board of Directors meet monthly, in addition to the many working groups. This past year has provided many continuous changes resulting in virtual events such as the Spring Conference, the AGM and webinars. CACPR Webinars have included topics such as COVID-19 and Cardiac Rehab Prevention, with great attendance. Reports have indicated that product offerings are moving in the right direction.

In 2020 / 2021 CACPR collaborated with the Heart and Stroke Foundation to develop a tool kit for virtual care to support the delivery of Cardiovascular Rehabilitation and Secondary Prevention. CACPR is keen to build on existing and create new partnerships.

2. Guidelines Update

Dr. Simon Bacon outlined the new guideline structure which consists of using strong evidence-based recommendations, using an implementable format and the literature will be viewed using a formal recognized system. The Guidelines will be easily accessible, and continuously reviewed for updates with the development of tools to support the guidelines.

The Exercise guideline group is still active, despite the disruption of COVID-19, and will be finished in the coming months. More information to be released in the summer regarding the upcoming General Behaviour Change and Nutrition groups.

3. Module Update

CV Risk Factors Module is complete and available for purchase. Additional Modules in progress include: Physical Activity, Psychosocial, Nutrition, Patient Management and Medication. Currently working on creating a COVID-19 Module to be released in the fall.

4. CV Edge Update

New representation on the editorial board includes the new president of BACPR and a CACPR student member. Publications have been difficult due to the pandemic; however, a Cardiac Rehab and COVID-19 issue was published in January 2021. Upcoming issues will include Atrial Fibrillation, Obesity and Exercise Prescription. A member survey is in the works for feedback on the publication.

5. Registry Update

The development of the IT infrastructure of the new registry has been the main focus with the development of key partnerships. An MOU agreement with Q-Statistic and participating site agreements with CACPR are in progress. Registry-ready sites have submitted data to the CorHealth Measurement Project. The future goals include finalizing agreements, defining a minimal (micro) data set, engage and support sites nationally and to continue to explore partnership opportunities to increase the value of the registry.

6. Membership Update

- 142 members; Associate: 9 (6%), Regular: 94 (66%), Retired: 4 (3%), and Student: 35 (25%)
- 36 new members to date for 2021
- Recorded 184 members last year
- Membership committee now has four participants
- Membership Committee is currently surveying members and non members as well as looking into developing a fellowship

7. Webinar Update

In 2020 there were 4 free and 10 paid webinars. To date for 2021 there have been 5 paid and one free COVID-19 webinar which was the most popular with over 300 attendees. The Webinar Committee is currently composed of four board members, along with four new members. Webinars for the remainder of 2021 have been identified and the 2022 webinars will be identified prior to member renewals. In February a Heart Health webinar bundle was offered and will be considered for 2022 also.

This additional funding (not included in the approved budget) should provide a surplus in 2021 and help rebuild reserves.

New Funding Sources

- In 2019, CACPR acquired a funding commitment from Bayer to re-establish and grow the Cardiac Registry Project. Project development in underway.
- In 2020, an additional corporate commitment to this project in the amount of \$130,000 (Cardiac Residual Risk Project) occurred and multiple pharma organizations have expressed interest in also contributing.
- As a result of Bayer funding obtained in 2018, CACPR has also been continuing to develop new webinar and other educational content. The scale of such web based educational products is proving to be popular and is providing for additional revenue of 16k expected in 2021.
